Exhibition of Learning Recap





Our students showcased their incredible versatility and talent by embodying the roles of not just scientists, writers, authors, artists, engineers, and mathematicians, but also innovators, problem solvers, critical thinkers, and leaders during our highly anticipated Exhibition of Learning! The depth of their knowledge and passion was truly awe-inspiring, as they delved into their respective fields with boundless enthusiasm and creativity.

For those who missed the event, here are some brief excerpts regarding each project:

Vive La Revolution - World History:

The students created booths to present information on the change they wanted to see in the world or the community. They designed trifold displays and brochures to promote their cause, engaging with visitors and speaking about their chosen issues. The goal was to encourage others to join their advocacy efforts.

Enlightenment Letter Project - World History:

The students wrote letters, channeling Enlightenment ideas to address global issues. They partnered to address specific problems in countries from the perspective of Enlightenment philosophers. The letters were displayed on a wall for public awareness and discussion.

Recyclable Device - Environmental Sustainability:

The students demonstrated the impact of environmental sustainability on daily lives through devices crafted from recyclable materials. They presented their devices, sharing data with community members who provided support for their efforts.

Compost Project - Biology:

Students explored the relationship between math and ecosystem dynamics through composting. Students educated the community about composting, emphasizing its importance. Community members engaged in sorting compostable and non-compostable items.

Object & Me (The Stories We Carry) - English 9 (H):

The students explored personal narratives through objects representing identity. They shared personal anecdotes, wrote narrative essays, and provided reflective commentary.

24/7 - Creative Writing:

The challenge was to condense significant life moments into 24-word stories that evoke shared experiences. Students identified and retold seven important life moments, engaging in significant editing for brevity.

Intersectional Self-Portrait - Philosophy:

Students explored categories of social identity like race, class, gender, sexual orientation, and religion. They created visual self-portraits representing central aspects of their identity.

IVA High Policy Proposals - Logic:

Students practiced identifying arguments, breaking them down into premises and conclusions, and objecting to arguments. They turned their attention to improving the IVA High community, drafting school policy and program proposals. Students presented their best arguments to a staff and faculty panel, receiving live feedback.





Classroom Highlights



Life Drawing: Unplug!

In Art class, students engaged in mindful life drawing through drawing their phones! This allowed students to "unplug" from their devices, while learning important artistic skills such as drawing from life, contour, and proportion. This was a warm up exercise leading up to their life drawing final



Microscope Stomata Lab

As part of the Photosynthesis and Respiration unit, students completed a lab to examine the structures and organelles involved in photosynthesis. Students used leaves and nail polish to isolate plant material that they viewed on a slide under 100X magnification using microscopes. The students then viewed the slides and drew images in their notebooks about the structures that they saw. Some students saw chloroplasts, some saw plant cell walls, and some even saw nuclei on the plant cells. The students also recorded these findings in the notebook.
